HOW TO COMPLETE THE OFFICIAL ONLINE NOMINATION FORM

- Select the "Nominate Now" button to enter your nomination. Read the instructions carefully before commencing. The nomination should clearly demonstrate the achievements of the nominee and address all the questions and guidelines for the category
- Upload into the attachments section copies of relevant newspaper articles, awards, certificates and photographs to support your nomination
- Attachments must be no larger than 3MB and a maximum of 10 items is permitted as word/jpeg/pdf files
- Each question has a limit of 750 words
